Periodontal Disease in pets (foul breath, dental tartar, swollen or bleeding gums and gum recession) is a common source of pain and infection that most often remains silent and can lead to significant health concerns if left untreated. The best way to prevent the progression of periodontal disease in your pet is by scheduling regular dental treatments along with routine dental home care (more about this below!).

WHY DOES MY PET HAVE STINKY BREATH?

Did you know that at least 70% of pets develop dental disease by the age of 2 years? Here are the most common sources of dental disease in pets:

AGE - Dental disease is more common in older pets


BREED - Small dogs, especially those with a flat face or short nose, are more likely to have overcrowded or misaligned teeth that are difficult to keep clean and more prone to dental issues

CATS are at high risk for tooth resorption which leads to open cavities known as 'resorptive lesions' and tooth root infections, ouch! Click **here** for more about dental disease in cats

HOW TO CARE FOR YOUR PET'S DENTAL HEALTH

Your pets are part of the family. Take care of them by making dental home care a priority

- Schedule regular dental checkups and cleanings as recommended by your vet
- Regularly brush your pet's teeth this is the single most effective way to keep their teeth health between cleanings
- Use dental treats, sprays/rinses, dental food and chews that are certified by the Veterinary Oral Health Council (VOHC)
